14B (p. 3)	Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, Almighty Father, for ever and ever.	Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, forever and ever. <i>[or keep as is, from Eucharistic Prayer for Children, and just add “and” before “in him”]</i>
