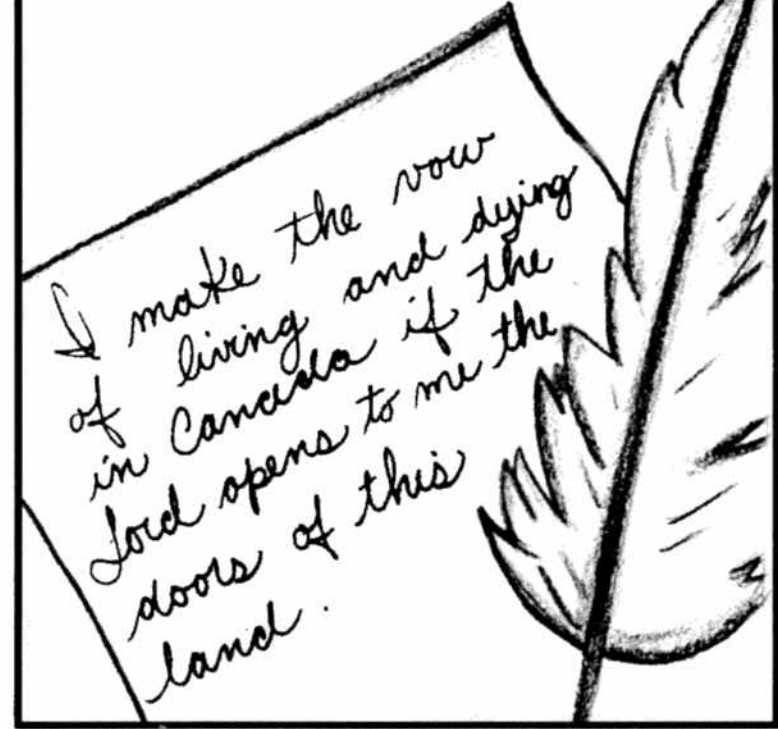

8 PEOPLE ARE AFRAID CATHERINE WILL DIE. BUT A VISIT FROM HEAVEN BRINGS HEALING.



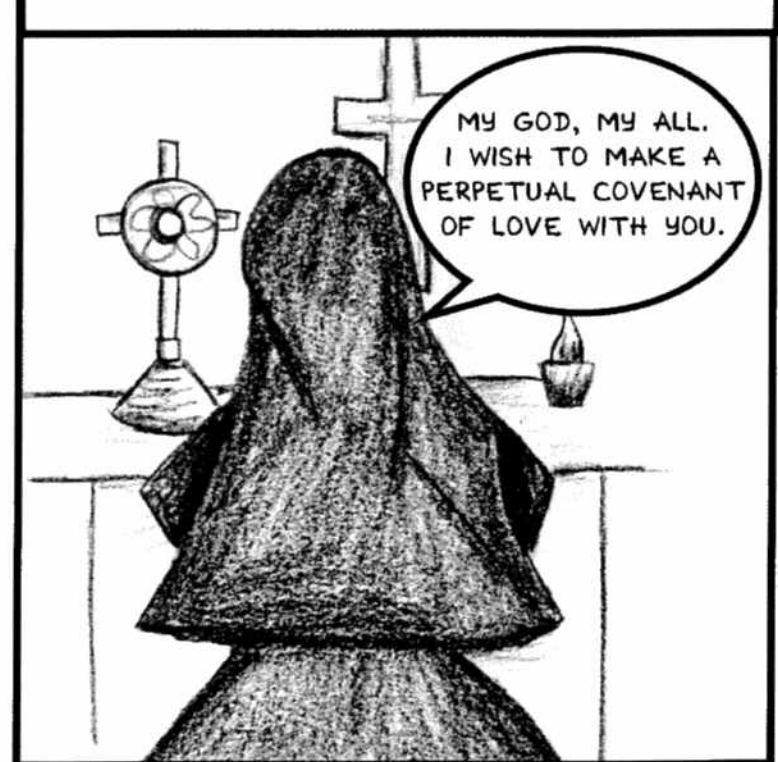
