

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JOURNEY TO PRIESTHOOD

DID YOU KNOW... that the Archdiocese of St. Boniface has seminarians in priestly formation at two Canadian seminaries? St. Joseph Seminary in Edmonton Alberta & St. Peters Seminary in London Ontario.

Four Pillars of Seminary Formation

- HUMAN FORMATION: enables the student to grow in their maturity; personal gifts; understanding of self and relationships, fostering an ability to work creatively and constructively with others; and understanding of sexuality with respect to their celibate vocation.
- INTELLECTUAL FORMATION: an undergraduate degree in humanities (Arts) with an emphasis on philosophy. Philosophy is considered important both because it sharpens the mind and because the language and concepts of philosophy form a good starting point for the study of theology. After the first degree, a graduate degree is achieved in theology (spirituality, history, canon law, sacraments, scripture, liturgy, moral and systematic theology and ecclesiology.)
- 3 SPIRITUAL FORMATION: helps the student deepen their life of prayer and relationship with God.
- PASTORAL FORMATION: helps the student develop the skills required for parish ministry; to be compassionate listeners, leaders, preachers and servants in the faith.

Our seminarians are supported through their formation process by their teachers, spiritual advisors, the Archbishop, local priests, family, friends and our community.

Seminarian Journey to Priesthood

YEAR

- 1 TO 3 Undergraduate degree in humanities (Bachelor of Arts) with an emphasis on philosophy taken at a post-secondary institution.
 - PROPAEDEUTIC/SPIRITUAL YEAR: Designed so the priestly candidate may enter into a quiet space and reflect over his relationship with Christ. It is essentially a year of self-discovery.
 - 5 & 6 Graduate studies in theology.
 - PASTORAL INTERNSHIP: spent in a local parish with a mentoring Pastor and parish community. The student immerses himself in parish life and learns about parish administration. Often this year is completed with the ordination to the transitional deaconate.
 - 8 Final year of theology.

ORDINATION TO PRIESTHOOD +

ARCHDIOCESAN DISCERNMENT GROUP

Every six weeks, individuals from across the Archdiocese meet to discuss various topics concerning a possible vocation to priesthood. Presently there are thirteen men from our Archdiocese who are inquiring about priesthood through the Vocation Discernment Group. For more information, contact Fr. Kevin Bettens.
