## MEET OUR SEMINARIANS 2020-21 -

As Archdiocesan Director for Vocations to the Priesthood, I journey with the seminarians and act as a liaison between them and the archdiocese, for example by introducing them to the clergy. Given that my ordination is recent, I am familiar with their formation. We are united in our understanding of what it means for a young man to choose a life of priesthood: a life of celibacy, unconditional obedience, and service.

Whether the seminarians are at St. Peter's or at St. Joseph Seminary, their formators are their main source of direction. However, my support role becomes more active during the summer months when they return to the archdiocese. We find time to pray together, to discuss common experiences in the discernment of our vocations, to share meals, to chat about our interests, such as soccer, and so on.

We form a culturally diverse group with different backgrounds and countries of origin. In my mind, all the seminarians are heroes because they joyfully leave behind the life they had before they started on this journey. They trust in Divine Providence, accepting that they will spend their whole life serving Christ within the Archdiocese of Saint Boniface no matter what mission they are assigned. I find it noteworthy that all our seminarians are fully embracing their new life dedicated to the Church of Saint Boniface, seizing every opportunity to get to know its people. This is strikingly true for the seminarians from other countries-they develop their English, and some their French, to minister in a foreign language. They discover how to live in a very culturally different environment, often with very hands-on experiences such as ice fishing!

Like all missionary disciples, young priests continue to discern their calling and to deepen their understanding of how to proclaim the Gospel in today's society. The laity's support is of immeasurable value in this ongoing process!
