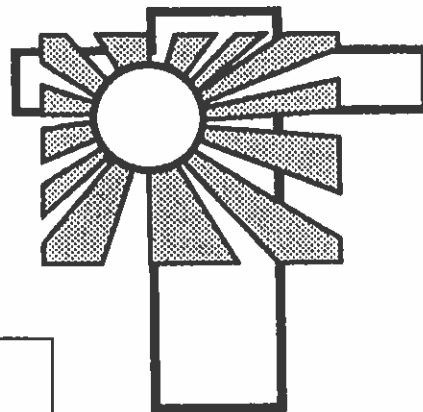

### TABLE OF THE WORD FOR OCTOBER 21, 2018 29<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



**FIRST READING (Isaiah 53.10-11):** The two verses from the fourth and final servant song in Isaiah describe how the sinless servant of the Lord justifies many through his own suffering. He gives his life as a sin offering. The Lord accomplishes his will through his servant.

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps. 33.4-5, 18-19, 20+22 (R.22)):** Psalm 33 becomes our prayer for God's mercy. We place our trust in the Lord and hope that he will deliver us from death and preserve us from suffering.

**SECOND READING :( Hebrews 4.14-16):** Despite being without sin, Jesus, our high priest, can sympathize with our weaknesses for he shares in the fullness of humanity. With confidence, we approach the throne of our high priest to receive his gifts of mercy and grace. We confess Jesus, the Son of God, raised and reigning forever with the Father in heaven.

**GOSPEL (Mark 10.35-45-30)** To be great is to serve. To be first is to serve. The Son of Man provides the example par excellence of this teaching for he came to "give his life as a ransom of the many." The longer form of the Gospel reading includes Jesus' response to James and John share in the cup he drinks and be baptized with his baptism. With good reason, the other ten Apostles became irate with the sons of Zebedee.

### REFLECTION

Jesus has intimated for the third time to his disciples that they are going to Jerusalem where he will be condemned and killed, in the manner of the mysterious Suffering Servant of God who by his suffering "shall justify the many" (Is 53:11). With a touch of irony, Mark records that at this solemn and sorrowful occasion, the Zebedee brothers are lost in their political illusions of religious triumphalism. They ask Jesus a share of power and profess to merit it by their resolve to stick with Jesus through thick and thin.

Jesus takes the occasion to inculcate a lesson on power and authority on the two brothers and the other ten disciples who behave no better, getting jealous of the two. Power is shown by a person's ability to stoop down and serve; the greatest among Jesus' followers are those who forget their position so as to minister to the needs of all.

Mark gives his readers two pictures. On one side is the despotic Herod Antipas who makes his importance felt by living in a grandiose palace, taxing the people, and deciding the fate of his servants. On the other side is Jesus who mingles with the poor and the outcast, who pays taxes, and who is later brought to trial before the high priests and rulers.

The lines are clearly drawn. When the disciple aims for power and takes side with the oppressors, he betrays his master. When the disciple who has been given the power and authority in the community turns to be a proud despot, looking for influence, get destroys the Church, turning it merely into a sociopolitical organization. When the Christian community allows itself to be blinded by the fascination of power and the strength of structure, it is no different from the pagans. It cannot be like that with Jesus' disciples.

Paul describes "positions" as "charisms," gifts of the Holy Spirit for the service of Christ's body (cf Cor 12:27-31). "Power" in the Church comes from service, and this, in a sense, is not determined by "positions" or "offices." St. Augustine, reflecting on his position as a bishop, wrote: "What I am with you gives me joy, what I am for you frighten me. For with you, I am a Christian; for you I am a bishop. The former is grace, the latter is an office. The former is salvation, the latter a temptation."

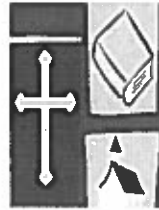

### **Pope Francis' invitation**

The Holy Father has decided to invite all the faithful, of all the world, to pray the Holy Rosary every day, during the entire Marian month of October, and thus to join in communion and in penitence, as the people of God, in asking the Holy Mother of God and Saint Michael Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other.

In recent days, before his departure for the Baltic States, the Holy Father met with Fr. Frédéric Fornos, S.J., international director of the World Network of Prayer for the Pope, and asked him to spread this appeal to all the faithful throughout the world, inviting them to conclude the recitation of the Rosary with the ancient invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium", and with the prayer to Saint Michael Archangel that he protect us and help us in the struggle against evil (cf. Revelation 12, 7-12).

The prayer - the Pontiff affirmed a few days ago, on 11 September, in a homily at Santa Marta, citing the first book of Job - is the weapon against the Great Accuser who "goes around the world seeking to accuse". Only prayer can defeat him. The Russian mystics and the great saints of all the traditions advised, in moments of spiritual turbulence, to shelter beneath the mantle of the Holy Mother of God pronouncing the invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium".

### **Sub Tuum Praesidium (Under Thy Protection)**

The invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium" is recited as follows:

*[We fly to thy protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin].*

The Holy Father has also asked that the recitation of the Holy Rosary during the month of October conclude with the prayer written by Leo XIII:

*[Saint Michael Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen].*

During the past year, I have had the privilege of supporting those considering the priesthood and the seminarians who have already chosen this vocational path. My role as Diocesan Director for Vocations to the Priesthood brings me great joy and hope in the future of our Archdiocese. I accompany those who aspire to ordination, first to the transitional diaconate and then to priesthood, as they:

- are instituted into the ministry of lector, that is to proclaim the readings from Sacred Scripture, with the exception of the Gospel, to announce the intentions for the Universal Prayer and to recite the Psalm between the readings;

- are instituted into the ministry of acolyte to serve at the altar, to assist the priest or deacon and to distribute the Eucharist;

- attend the Rite of Candidacy to pursue their formation first for the diaconate and then for the priesthood.
