Jesus is indignant with the disciples for the same reason he confronts the Pharisees for their “hardness of ... hearts,” Jesus contrasts the, “hardness of ... hearts” that led to the Mosaic Law permitting divorce with the openness of heart he modeled when he embraced and blessed the children. In the midst of real struggles and difficulties marking human relationships, we are to maintain the openness of heart—like Jesus and innocent children—that was God’s intention “from the beginning of creation.” In such openness of heart the kingdom of God is among us.

Returning to Spirit Workshops – November 2018 As a Canadian Society and as a Church, we have been called to reconcile our history with the Indigenous people concerning the legacy of both the Indian Residential Schools and colonization. The main purpose of the Returning to Spirit Foundational workshop is to empower you to reconcile you to you, you to others and you to life. Reconciliation is a call and yearning of the human heart at its root, even more from a Christian heart. There will be a 2-weekend RTS Foundational Workshop which will take place on Saturday, November 3 & Sunday, November 4 AND Saturday, November 10 & Sunday, November 11, 2018. In January 2019, there will be a 4-day RTS Foundational Workshop which will be held from Wednesday to Saturday, January 9-12, 2019. Just as past generations built our Church, it is now our responsibility to continue to nurture and develop these gifts for future generations.
