Masses for the Upcoming Week

Theme: The Man. Bartimaeus

Bartimaeus occupies a central place in today's Gospel reading, in spite of the huge crowd that was following Jesus. He was a man acquainted with darkness on account of his blindness, but must have been grateful to God for still having a gift of hearing. On learning that Jesus was passing by, he raised his voice and pleaded for mercy. The more the crowd tried to silence him, the louder he shouted. The reason was because he knew what he wanted in life, namely, restoration of sight: "My teacher let me see again" he said. Do we know what we really want in life? Bartimaeus would get rid of whatever would prevent him from coming face to face with Jesus, even his only cloak. "What do you want me to do for you?" is the question Jesus addresses not only to Bartimaeus but also to us today. Think of what you would want Jesus to do for you as we celebrate this Sunday's Eucharist but do not forget to remove any obstacle on your way to meeting Jesus just like Bartimaeus.

1st Reading: Jeremiah 31:7-9, God's people will return from exile with weeping but with consolations he will lead them back.

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.

2nd Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6, God chooses and appoints his Priest. It is not an honour to be taken by anyone except one who is

called. Christ is the ideal High Priest, whose priesthood is forever according to the order of Melchizedek.

Gospel: Mark 10:46-52, Jesus hears the cry of Bartimaeus and restores his sight.
