1. The Archdiocese of St. Boniface Social Media Policy (SMP)

The *Archdiocese of St. Boniface Social Media Policy (SMP)* applies to web development & web strategy. *View SMP document.*

2. Website Controls

In conjunction with the SMP, there are some **Website Controls** which parish staff or volunteers, who have been assigned to update sections of the website, should follow.

- The website must be administered by at least 2 adults who are assigned to manage the website (ideally, never one person). One of these delegates must be a supervisor.
- Optimize image/photo size of images or photos which are downloaded on the website. The smaller the size, the faster your website will be. Limit size to no larger than 300-800 pixels (resize images ex. in Paint, before downloading on the website). A website that loads in less than 4 seconds is more likely to rank better in search results, get more page visits per user, get more conversions.
- Use consistent font type, style and size throughout the website.
- Avoid posting of Word documents or Excel files online, in order to avoid the possibility of unauthorized changes being applied.
- Convert all .doc, .xcl, and .ppt files to locked pdf files whenever possible before publishing.
- Use the Archdiocese of St. Boniface Policy for Photos, Parental Consent Form and Implicit Consent Announcement as required by various situations. Please refer to the document **Policies & Procedures for Photos and Videos.**

Due to the proliferation of WordPress website templates out there and the fact that many of them do not specifically say "Wordpress" on them, it is quite likely that WordPress is dramatically under-reported and the clear winner among open source solutions. It is important to mention that WordPress is a technology platform not a church website service. With the template solutions available from WeConnect, eCatholic, and OSV, the parish receives a complete solution package including support. The WordPress open source code is "free" but requires a volunteer or local consulting firm to assist, a website hosting plan, and possibly an external consultant.



4. Important Elements of a Parish Website

An important tool for effectively communicating the vibrancy of your parish, a parish website is not a plot of land on the Internet, a billboard, or directory listing of events. A parish website is a destination for seekers to learn more about Jesus Christ and parishioners' window into their world of faith.



If your mission is to share the good news with all who will listen, it is necessary to take the role that your

parish website has in that mission seriously. To understand how to reach that goal, there are ten vital components that make your parish website vibrant.

- 1- Offer a brief catechesis & evangelization in an easy to digest manner
- 2- Welcome the first-time visitor
- 3- Post your Mass times (Sunday and weekend), Adoration & Confession Times
- 4- Have a map with directions
- 5- Give them a phone number to call
- 6- Update your calendar
- 7- Highlight your parish and parishioners outside of Sunday Mass
- 8- Provide a place for others to share their resources and talents towards the mission
- 9- Be mobile friendly

10- Designate at least two church staff persons to manage your website and ensure it is updated!

- *Contact Us* information in the top right corner: Parish Office, Parish Pastor, Parish Leaders
- Social Media icons in the header
- Search button visible
- Welcome Message
- Vision; Mission; Historical Overview; Photos of the Church (interior & exterior)
- How to join; How to donate button
- Description & photo of various parish ministries & committees, ex. Youth, Social Justice, Liturgy of the Word for Children, Knights of Columbus, Prayer Groups, Parish Pastoral Council; Parish Financial Council, etc.
- Parish Bulletins
- Email sign-up for the Parish Bulletin
- Religious Education Classes (Catechesis)
- Preparation Classes for Sacraments (Baptism, Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation, Marriage)
- Availability of Sacrament/Anointing of the Sick
- Sacrament of Holy Orders the date of any ordination occurring in the diocese
- Sacrament of Matrimony the date of any wedding celebrated in your parish
- Parish Life, ex. Events; Testimonies; Faith Stories; Photos; Short Videos
