The 7th generation of the renewed Nathanael Lay Formation Program begins in September 2015.

Over 350 participants from the Archdiocese of Saint Boniface have completed the formation since the inception of the program in 1988. They have grown in their faith and have deepened their commitment as disciples of Christ. They have strengthened their sense of belonging to the Church.

What can you and your Parish Council do?

- ✓ **Pray for discernment** and compile a list of parishioners whom you believe God is calling.
- ✓ Gather the **Nathanael alumni** and ask them to have a prayer brainstorming for potential candidates.
- ✓ Gather the ARISE Together in Christ groups and show them how Nathanael is a way to continue to grow in their faith.
- ✓ **Personally call forth people** who you would see taking part in this formation and tell them that you see them as candidates. In keeping with our Theology and Spirituality of **Vocation** we ask you and your parish community to **call** men and women to this formation that gives them a more conscious and authentic response to their baptismal vocation and their mission in today's world
- ✓ Place Brochures on your **bulletin board**.
- ✓ Give a sermon on the value of the formation.
- ✓ Ask people to **share** how the Nathanael Formation has enriched their faith walk during the announcements after Communion.
- ✓ Make contacts in person or by phone.
- ✓ Gather people in an **information session**. Ask the Nathanael alumni to answer questions about their experience. Speak about the **4 Open Doors** *Come* & *See* that will take place in April.
- ✓ Hand out **Info Kits** to those interested. *Requests for Interview* forms would come back to you for your signature before they are sent to the Nathanael office.

Schedule for the Discernment Process. Once we have received the forms from your parish, the prospective candidates will be invited to an interview. Following the interviews, the Formation Team will make a formal recommendation to the Archbishop for which candidates to accept into the Nathanael Lay Formation Program.

May to mid June	Formation Team will interview prospective candidates and consult

	Formation Program.
June 2015	Letters of acceptance will go out to candidates and Pastors and Parish
	Life Directors.
