Pope Francis - December 17, 1936 - April 21, 2025



It is with profound sadness that the Archdiocese of Saint Boniface learned of the passing of Pope Francis on the morning of April 21st.

"Pope Francis was and continues to be a source of inspiration for Catholics, notes Archbishop Albert LeGatt. He significantly impacted the life of the Church and the life of the world. He will be profoundly missed. His teachings and personal example will surely live on.

"For all in the world, he was a tireless defender of the poor, the downtrodden, victims of war, migrants, survivors of clergy abuse and the marginalized. He continually called for peace and solidarity, as well as a proper stewardship of the environment.

"His heartfelt apology in 2022 to the Indigenous of Canada and his recognition of the Church's role in the repression of their language, culture and spirituality that occurred in residential schools was an important milestone in the continuing journey of reconciliation with First Nations, Inuit and Métis people across the country, and in our own archdiocese. "For the Church, Pope Francis brought profound changes through his advancement of synodality, of listening to all as a way to foster a greater participation by all in the Church's life. He brought special attention to young people, families and those distant from the Church. He continued the transformation of the Church's administration and its financial transparency.

"We ask all the faithful to keep the Holy Father in their prayers."

We ask that Pope Francis be welcomed into your presence, O Lord, accompanied by the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, St. Francis of Assisi, and all the saints, and that you would bring comfort to us, Pilgrims of Hope, who mourn.

A memorial Mass for Pope Francis, presided by Archbishop LeGatt, will be held this Friday, April 25th at 7:30 PM in Saint Boniface Cathedral. All are invited to attend.

This young Italian (1991-2006) was considered a "computer geek" but his passion was for God and the Eucharist. NEW Campaign Life Coalition MB: CCCB Protests Proposed Removal of Tax Exemptions from Churches The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) have written to the Liberal government, requesting that they abandon Recommendations 429 and 430, which would remove tax exemptions for religious and pro-life groups. Their letter states: "We wish to express our grave concerns regarding the proposed legislative changes to the eligibility criteria for charitable status. The Catholic charitable sector in Canada, includes a wide range of community services including foodbanks, soup kitchens, refugee resettlement programs, social justice programs, daycares and schools, hospitals, long-term care homes and palliative care centers, to name but a few examples. These compassionate, Catholic services are available to all Canadians." Furthermore, "A recent study found that the cost of replacing the services offered by faith congregations in Canada is \$16.5 billion. Simply put, places of worship provide benefits to society that radiate far beyond their congregations."

NEW Statement to the Catholic Faithful by the Permanent Council of the CCCB on the 2025 Federal Election

In this Jubilee Year of Hope 2025, as we prepare for a federal election in Canada, it is essential that, as citizens and Catholics, we reflect on the challenges currently facing our nation with a spirit of hope and a vision for a better future.

In a free and democratic society, all those eligible to vote have not only a right, but also a responsibility to engage with local candidates and political parties. We are called to discern which policies best serve the common good—that which the Church defines as "the sum of those conditions of ... social life whereby people, families and associations more adequately and readily may attain their own perfection" (Gaudium et Spes, n. 74.1). As

faithful citizens, we are invited to help shape our earthly society in accordance with God's divine plan, always mindful that "our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Phil 3:20). Our Catholic faith provides essential moral and social guidance, helping us understand and respond to the critical issues facing our country. The role of pastors—especially the Pope and bishops—is to articulate the principles of faith and Church teaching so that the lay faithful may form their consciences accordingly. As the Church teaches, it is the duty of the faithful "to see that the divine law is inscribed in the life of the earthly city" (Gaudium et Spes, n. 43.2).

REMINDER Bishops raise serious concerns about threats to charitable status designation

On Monday, 10 March 2025, the members of the Permanent Council of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) expressed their grave concern regarding two recommendations made by the House of Commons Standing Committee on Finance within *Report 21: Pre-Budget Consultations in Advance of the 2025 Budget*. These recommendations (#429 and #430), if adopted, would be profoundly detrimental to Canada's charitable sector, because they would:

- Revoke the charitable status of "anti-abortion organizations" (#429);
- Amend the *Income Tax Act* such that "the advancement of religion" would no longer qualify as a legitimate purpose for granting charitable status. (#430)

After consulting widely, including with experts in charity law, the members of the Permanent Council sent a letter to the Hon. Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Finance, defending the value and role of faith-based charities for Canadian society, as well as the unfairness of targeting pro-life organizations. They urged the government to abandon the two recommendations and to conduct comprehensive consultations within the charitable sector before embarking on any legislative changes that could threaten the viability of charitable organizations and adversely affect the millions of Canadians who depend on them for essential services and support.




