



UPDATED G7 Jubilee People's Forum – June 12 to 25, 2025


Development and Peace-KAIROS Canada's ongoing <u>Turn</u> <u>Debt into Hope</u> campaign is part of the Jubilee 2025 call to end the unjust debt that is undermining human, social and economic development in the Global South. Addressing the global debt crisis is within the powers of the leaders of the world's wealthiest countries, who will gather for the G7 summit in Alberta this summer. To rally the people's voice for debt justice and carry it to

the G7 leaders, KAIROS Canada is organizing a <u>G7 Jubilee People's Forum</u>. This ecumenical Forum will be held at Ambrose University in **Calgary** from **June 12 to 15, 2025.** It will be a space for pilgrims and activists to connect for community, learning, prayer and action. It will include a worship service hosted by the Calgary Interfaith Council; a visit to a medicine wheel on Stoney Nakoda land; testimonies from Indigenous and global partners; Jubilee campaign training; and a creative public action in the heart of Calgary.

Registration is open until May 25, and **fees include all sessions and meals**. Students and persons on lower incomes pay subsidized rates. Limited travel bursaries of up to \$500 are now available for students. Event and registration details are available on <u>KAIROS Canada's website</u>.

REMINDER Bridgefolk Conference 2025: Ecumenical Dialogue in an Age of Polarization – July 24-27, 2025

Bridgefolk is a grassroots ecumenical movement of Mennonites and Roman Catholics who work together toward Christian unity by "proceeding through friendship." Newcomers are always welcome at Bridgefolk gatherings, regardless of religious affiliation. Most of the conference will be held at First Mennonite Church, Winnipeg, Manitoba. One evening of the conference will be held at St. Kateri Catholic Parish as its building lives the Mennonite - Catholic dialogue in a very practical way, since St. Kateri and Aberdeen Mennonite Church share the same building and are starting to work on a few projects together. The evening

at St. Kateri (Saturday, July 28) will be the foot-washing liturgy that is a feature of every Bridgefolk Conference. This year's conference will look at the birth of Anabaptism from both a Mennonite and a Roman Catholic perspective, what has changed in the past five centuries, and what the implications are for ecumenical dialogue today. Mennonite keynote: **Dr. Jennifer Otto**, Associate Professor in the Department of History and Religion at the University of Lethbridge. Catholic keynote: **Fr. John Klassen** OSB, retired abbot of Saint John's Abbey, in Collegeville, Minnesota. The conference will also feature a panel discussion with others involved in ecumenical dialogue and work, locally and elsewhere, and a workshop to equip participants with practical tools to engage in respectful dialogue as well as small groups in which to practice these tools. REMINDER Critical Camp Update from the Catholic School of Evangelization

Dear parents, campers, and benefactors.

Over the last few years our camp ministry has been facing increased challenges related to camp staffing, recruiting volunteers, and hiring people that can run our camps equally well in both French and English. We've often found ways of working around the challenges in front of us with varying degrees of success, however this year is different. With less than 2 months till camps start, there are still too many challenges to work around and we feel the need to adapt to our circumstances as early as possible so families can make necessary changes to their summer plans.

We are making some significant changes to our summer camp schedule so we can move forward with the staff that we have in place and guarantee a camp program that's run with excellence. Please know that countless hours of discussion and discernment have been put into this by the Camp Advisory Committee and these decisions have been weighing heavily on our minds for a long time. We're aware that these changes may drastically affect your summer plans, and that they may even prevent some children from being able to attend camp this year. Please accept our sincerest apologies and deepest regrets.

Here are the changes that we need to make to this summer's camp programming.

- 1. The **<u>8-12 overnight camps</u>** will run from Sunday to Tuesday (2 nights) and will both be run in English only
 - 1. The camp dates for these are July 6-8 and July 13-15
 - 2. The early bird pricing for these camps are now \$140, and the regular rate is \$160 (\$20 family discounts still apply)
- 2. We will be running only 1 week of overnight camps for ages 12-15 and will be run in English only
 - 1. The camp dates for this are August 3-8 (The July 27th to August 1st week is cancelled)
 - 2. All existing registrants for the week of July 27-August 1st will be transferred automatically to this new English week
- 3. There is no change to the programming or languages of the ages 5-8 day camps

We will certainly fully reimburse anyone who chooses to cancel their registrations. We will also be refunding the difference of \$185 to parents with children registered for the 8-12 camps. These refunds will happen in the coming weeks and we ask for your patience as we sort through the logistics of these changes.

Habemus papam!



The Church in Canada and throughout the world rejoices, as His Eminence Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost, O.S.A., after being duly elected by the College of Cardinals, has accepted to become the 267th Bishop of Rome, successor of Saint Peter, and vicar of Christ on earth! Taking the name Leo XIV, the Roman Pontiff, as the successor of Saint Peter, is the "perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity both of the Bishops and the whole company of the faithful" (Lumen Gentium, no. 23). As our loving shepherd and spiritual guide, Pope Leo XIV's ministry is to orient Christ's flock toward the kingdom of heaven, where the citizenship of Christians truly lies (cf. Philippians 3:20-21).

Pope Leo XIV was born in Chicago, Illinois, on 14 September 1955. As a member of the Order of Saint Augustine (O.S.A.), in which he held various leadership positions, he dedicated many years of service to the Augustinian missions in Peru as a priest and seminary professor. He was eventually appointed Bishop of Chiclayo, Peru, by Pope Francis. As a Bishop of the Church in Peru, he served as Vice President and member of the Permanent Council of the Peruvian Bishops' Conference. In 2023, Pope Francis appointed him as Prefect of the Dicastery of Bishops and elevated him to the College of Cardinals. Pope Leo XIV holds a doctorate in canon law from the Pontifical College of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome.

Commenting on this historic moment, the President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Most Rev. William T. McGrattan, Bishop of Calgary, asks the faithful to embrace the new Pope: "I encourage the faithful in Canada to unite with their local Ordinary in welcoming Pope Leo XIV as our new Holy Father, and to remember him daily in their prayers so that he may embark on his Petrine ministry with fidelity, confident that the Lord will help him."

As the Church in Canada rejoices with Christians throughout the world, let us remember our new Holy Father in prayer, that despite the considerable weight of his role and responsibilities, his yoke may be easy and his burden light (cf. Matthew 11:28-20). May God grant strength and wisdom to our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV, and may Mary, Mother of the Church, be ever at his side, guarding him with her mantle of protection.
