

\*NEW\* Assumption University Graduate Diploma in Catholic Studies – Fall 2025 Admission now open

DEADLINE TO SUBMIT IS AUGUST 15, 2025 AT NOON

Topics in Catholic Studies – Catholicism and Marginalization: CATH 8500 (3.00 Credit) – This course will focus on special topics on interest in Catholic studies, such as, bioethics, education,

literature, global poverty, migration, the saints, the papacy, social teachings, and theology of the body. This course's content will change on a yearly basis. Students may obtain credit for this course a maximum of twice provided that the course topic has changed. The topic is Catholicism and Marginalization. Dr. Heejung Cho will be teaching Catholicism and Marginalization this fall.

**Directed Readings in Catholic Studies: CATH 8800 (3.00 Credit)** – This course will allow students to study a specific topic not covered in detail by a course currently offered in the program. The students will select a topic and readings in consultation with an instructor. It is required that students have weekly content and complete a final project at the conclusion of the course. Typically, students will be permitted to complete this course once and only with permission from the Graduate Chair.

Major Paper in Catholic Studies: CATH 9000 (3.00 Credit) – This course will provide students with an opportunity to undertake an independent research project on any topic related to Catholic studies with the goal of writing a major paper that perhaps could be submitted to a refereed journal or edited book. In the course, students will submit a formal proposal that includes research questions, literature review, methods, and a preliminary bibliography. After writing the paper, students will be required to present their paper at an oral defense. Admission is with permission of the Graduate Chair.



# \*REMINDER\* G7 Jubilee People's Forum – June 12 to 25, 2025


Development and Peace-KAIROS Canada's ongoing <u>Turn Debt into Hope</u> campaign is part of the Jubilee 2025 call to end the unjust debt that is undermining human, social and economic development in the Global South. Addressing the global debt crisis is within the powers of the leaders of the world's wealthiest countries, who will gather for the G7 summit in Alberta this summer. To rally the people's voice for debt justice and carry it to

the G7 leaders, KAIROS Canada is organizing a G7 Jubilee People's Forum. This ecumenical Forum will be held at Ambrose University in Calgary from June 12 to 15, 2025. It will be a space for pilgrims and activists to connect for community, learning, prayer and action. It will include a worship service hosted by the Calgary Interfaith Council; a visit to a medicine wheel on Stoney Nakoda land; testimonies from Indigenous and global partners; Jubilee campaign training; and a creative public action in the heart of Calgary.

Registration is open until May 25, and fees include all sessions and meals. Students and persons on lower incomes pay subsidized rates. # \*REMINDER\* Bridgefolk Conference 2025: Ecumenical Dialogue in an Age of Polarization – July 24-27, 2025

Bridgefolk is a grassroots ecumenical movement of Mennonites and Roman Catholics who work together toward Christian unity by "proceeding through friendship." Newcomers are always welcome at Bridgefolk gatherings, regardless of religious affiliation. Most of the conference will be held at First Mennonite Church, Winnipeg, Manitoba. One evening of the conference will be held at St. Kateri Catholic Parish - as its building lives the Mennonite - Catholic dialogue in a very practical way, since St. Kateri and Aberdeen Mennonite Church share the same building and are starting to work on a few projects together. The evening

at St. Kateri (Saturday, July 28) will be the foot-washing liturgy that is a feature of every Bridgefolk Conference. This year's conference will look at the birth of Anabaptism from both a Mennonite and a Roman Catholic perspective, what has changed in the past five centuries, and what the implications are for ecumenical dialogue today. Mennonite keynote: **Dr. Jennifer Otto**, Associate Professor in the Department of History and Religion at the University of Lethbridge. Catholic keynote: **Fr. John Klassen** OSB, retired abbot of Saint John's Abbey, in Collegeville, Minnesota. The conference will also feature a panel discussion with others involved in ecumenical dialogue and work, locally and elsewhere, and a workshop to equip participants with practical tools to engage in respectful dialogue as well as small groups in which to practice these tools. 

\*NEW\* "Trust, Rights, and Human Dignity" Podcast Now Available
Hear Dr. Stanley Amaladas of the Mauro Institute for Peace & Justice at St. Paul's
College on the "Humans, On Rights" podcast: "Trust, Rights, and Human Dignity".
In this podcast, host Stuart Murray sits down with Dr. Stanley Amaladas, Director of
the Arthur V. Mauro Institute for Peace and Justice at St. Paul's College and
University of Manitoba. Dr. Amaladas reflects on his journey from Malaysia to
Canada and shares a powerful story about his citizenship interview that shaped his
understanding of human rights, responsibility, and dignity.

This podcast explores:

- How an uncomfortable citizenship interview became a lesson about rights, power, and responsibility.
  - The difference between the legal framework of rights and our human

responsibility to others.

- Why "who's right and who's wrong?" is often the wrong question in conflict resolution.
- Amaladas' vision for continuing Arthur Mauro's dream of making Winnipeg a "cultural centre for hope".
- The importance of approaching difficult conversations with curiosity instead of judgment.
- How we can speak to those in positions of power "in a way that is not tyrannical".

Dr. Amaladas brings both academic expertise in Leadership Studies and personal experience to this thoughtful discussion about what it means to lead for peace. His perspective on treating people as people first - recognizing their dignity beyond their utility - offers an important lesson for navigating today's divided world. As Dr. Amaladas reminds us: "It's not going to come from theories or big ideas. It's going to come from people who treat people as people."

The <u>Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA Canada)</u> invites you to a special webinar featuring **Argaw Fantu**, **CNEWA's Regional Director in Ethiopia**, to discuss the current situation in the country. Many communities are facing extreme hardship, particularly in the regions where CNEWA is actively working to provide support. 
