# \*REMINDER\* Diocesan Celebration for the Closing of the Jubilee 2025 Year – December 28, 2025

The Ordinary Jubilee of 2025 will conclude in the particular Churches on Sunday, 28 December 2025, the Feast of the Holy Family. Our diocesan celebration will be at Saint-Boniface Cathedral at 3:00 PM, with a light reception to follow. We invite all priests, deacons, and lay faithful to join us in thanksgiving as we mark the end of this Pilgrimage of Hope.

Until that time, the free gift of the Jubilee Plenary Indulgence remains available to all who:

- Make a pilgrimage to one of the named Jubilee Sites, or
- Make a pious visit to one of the named Jubilee Sites, or
- Participate in works of mercy and penance;

And, in conformity to the usual norms for a plenary indulgence:

- · Intend to receive the indulgence, and
- Receive Holy Communion and the sacrament of Reconciliation within several days of the indulgenced work, and
- · Are free from attachment to all mortal and venial sin, and
- Say a prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father.

For the Universal Church, this date will also be when the Holy Doors of the Papal Cathedral of Saint John Lateran, the Papal Basilica of Saint Mary Major, and the Papal Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls are closed.

The Ordinary Jubilee will formally conclude with the closing of the Holy Door in the Papal Basilica of Saint Peter in the Vatican on 6 January 2026, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. As Pope Francis wrote in his letter announcing the Jubilee Year...

"During the Holy Year, may the light of Christian hope illumine every man and woman, as a message of God's love addressed to all! And may the Church bear faithful witness to this message in every part of the world!"






# \*REMINDER\* Bishop LeGatt Video – Memento Mori




### \*REMINDER\* Pastoral Services – Annual Report 2024–2025

# \*NEW\* Launch of the National Ecumenical Strategy

Monday, November 24, 2025

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops is pleased to announce the publication of the *National Ecumenical Strategy* (NES), a major milestone in its ongoing commitment to fostering Christian unity and strengthening interfaith relationships in Canada.

Over the past year, the <u>Episcopal Commission for Christian Unity, Religious</u> <u>Relations with the Jews, and Interfaith Dialogue</u> has focused on advancing the primary goal identified in the 2021 audit and review of Conference-sponsored dialogues: the development of a comprehensive national strategy to guide ecumenical engagement.


The Episcopal Commission hopes that the NES will serve as a valuable and versatile resource—a "multi-tool" for the ecumenical efforts of local churches across the country. The Strategy is expected to play a key role in the formation and ongoing support of diocesan and eparchial ecumenical officers and commissions. A companion document on interfaith dialogue is planned for release in the coming year.

OTTAWA, 17 November 2025 – Today, His Holiness Pope Leo XIV appointed Father Susai Jesu, O.M.I., as Archbishop of Keewatin-Le Pas.

He replaces the Most Reverend Murray Chatlain, who served as Archbishop of Keewatin-Le Pas beginning in 2012. Archbishop Chatlain has served as Diocesan Administrator of Keewatin-Le Pas since being installed as Archbishop of Winnipeg on 4 April 2025.




