From September 17 to 29, Louise Normandeau traveled throughout the diocese to present Carlo Acutis, the saint of young people and internet users. The Quebec native worked tirelessly to give 24 presentations on the young man who was canonized on September 7. She visited three schools, five retirement homes, and 17 parishes, sometimes two or three times apiece, speaking to different age groups. All this to highlight the ardent faith of the young Italian who was buried in sneakers for Christ and his enthusiasm for Eucharistic miracles. In all, 1,257 people attended the gatherings and deepened their knowledge of the first millennial saint and the Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament. Thank you to all the generous photographers. This year's theme for Saint-Boniface's Diocesan Study Days is **Sexuality and Identity: Catholic Pastoral Accompaniment.**

Listen to presentations by:

- Fr. Kevin Belgrave, professor at St. Augustine Seminary in Toronto who teaches on bioethics, foundations of moral theology, human sexuality, and Catholic social teachings. He'll be speaking to us about the Catholic anthropology of human sexuality.
- Dr. Julia Sadusky, clinical psychiatrist from Colorado who offers individual, family, and couples therapy in addition to consultations for individuals and families around sexuality and gender, and author of Start Talking to Your Kids about Sex: A Practical Guide for Catholics and Talking with Your Teen about Sex: A Practical Guide for Catholics.
- Deacon Gilles Urquhart, permanent deacon for the Archdiocese of Saint-Boniface and chaplain for Courage, which offers pastoral support in the form of spiritual guidance, community prayer support, and fellowship for those who experience same-sex attraction. He is also chaplain for EnCourage, an apostolate that helps its members work together to understand the experiences of their loved ones, and to respond to them with compassion.
- Bob Hall, a member of Courage since 1992, who will share his testimony of how Courage has helped him find faith, love, and community.

The presentations will be in English, with French simultaneous translation available for those who need it. There will be French and English small group discussions after each presentation, and opportunities for Q&A with the various speakers. Come either Thursday Oct 23, or Saturday Oct 25, from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM, at Saint-Boniface Cathedral Hall, 180 ave de la Cathédrale, Winnipeg. The same message will be shared each day.


REMINDER Christian Meditation Day - November 15, 2025


REMINDER Nostra Aetate: 60 Years of Jewish-Christian Dialogue – October 22, 2025

Antisemitism in Canada today is more pervasive and aggressive than ever before. A July 22, 2025 Statistics Canada report on crime notes that in 2024, Jewish people were the group most targeted by hate crimes in the country. Almost 19%, or 920, of the nearly 4,900 reported hate crimes and almost 70% of religiously motivated hate crimes were against Jewish people - even though they make up only 0.9% of the population. The Asper Foundation and the Jewish Heritage Centre of Western Canada announce the creation of the Manitoba Institute to Combat Antisemitism, an action-oriented education-centered weapon against hate.

The Institute offers customized training for students, educators, non-profit organizations, businesses and professional groups to educate participants about the genesis and evolution of antisemitism—and how to fight it.

Jewish Manitobans have played a vital role in shaping this province, contributing to every aspect of civic, cultural, and economic life. Since October 7, 2023, the province has seen an unprecedented surge in antisemitism, arising through the spread of disinformation and amplification of extremist ideologies. This toxic mix is fueling threats and violence against members of Manitoba's Jewish community. Antisemitism endangers our shared values, disrupts national security and erodes democracy. The Institute's mission is to provide education and training to empower people with the tools needed to foster a peaceful, inclusive, and respectful society and to respond—with clarity and action.

Belle Jarniewski, Executive Director of the Jewish Heritage Centre of Western Canada, will lead the Institute. Belle was appointed to Canada's delegation to the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) by the federal government in 2013 and serves on the Education Working Group and the Committee on Antisemitism and Holocaust Denial. A University of Manitoba Gold Medalist in the Faculty of Education, Belle has taught thousands of Manitoba students and educators about the Holocaust and antisemitism since 2010. She has also led training sessions for professionals in law, medicine, and law enforcement, including the Winnipeg Police Service.

The Manitoba Institute to Combat Antisemitism is now available to deliver this essential service to any group seeking to understand and counter the scourge of antisemitism.


