


IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO REGISTER! 2025 Diocesan Study Days – October 23 or 25, 2025



I'd long felt a call over the years to serve the Church as a potential cleric, but it was while livestreaming the 2020 Easter Vigil at Holy Cross Parish during the COVID-19 pandemic that I clearly felt the Spirit calling me to the diaconate. Since then, the formation process has been one of continuous growth in God's grace and love for Jesus and the Church.

It is also challenging, as candidates must juggle online studies, in-person formation, ministry inside and outside the parish, and full-time work. The deepening and growth of my spiritual life has been a great help to me. The Lord is good!

My ministry of charity outside my parish is to accompany separated and divorced persons. Those who are experiencing a breakup in their relationships experience a great deal of pain and grief; they need a safe and sacred space where they can find their bearings, share their journey, pray, and find the soothing embrace of Christ.

There is a real need for this ministry, and over the last two and a half years, I've seen just how important it is to be present for them. To see the brokenhearted recover and rediscover themselves in joy is a tremendous blessing and a witness to God's gentle and infinite mercy.

All this to highlight the ardent faith of the young Italian who was buried in sneakers for Christ and his enthusiasm for Eucharistic miracles. NEW Assumption University Graduate Diploma in Catholic Studies – Winter 2026 Admission

The diploma is considered a hiring asset by <u>eight</u> Catholic school boards in Ontario. Also, the diploma has a pathway toward an M.A., M.Ed., M.Div. or M.T.S. degree.

Catholicism and Dialogue: CATH 8200 (3.00 Credit) – This course studies Catholicism's ecumenical and interfaith initiatives with a focus on mutual understanding, acceptance, and healing. This course will explore the Church's interactions with several traditions, including Anglicanism, Protestantism, Orthodoxy, Judaism, Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, and Atheism. This course will also discuss the Church's path towards reconciliation with Indigenous communities both in Canada and abroad.

Directed Readings in Catholic Studies: CATH 8800 (3.00 Credit) -

This course will allow students to study a specific topic not covered in detail by a course currently offered in the program. The students will select a topic and readings in consultation with an instructor. It is required that students have weekly content and complete a final project at the conclusion of the course. Typically, students will be permitted to complete this course once and only with permission from the Graduate Chair.

Major Paper in Catholic Studies: CATH 9000 (3.00 Credit) -

This course will provide students with an opportunity to undertake an independent research project on any topic related to Catholic studies with the goal of writing a major paper that perhaps could be submitted to a refereed journal or edited book. In the course, students will submit a formal proposal that includes research questions, literature review, methods, and a preliminary bibliography. After writing the paper, students will be required to present their paper at an oral presentation. Admission is with permission of the Graduate Chair.


REMINDER Christian Meditation Day - November 15, 2025

Walking Together - Truth and Reconciliation



As an Indigenous-led non-profit organization delivering reconciliation workshops since 2001, **Returning to Spirit** is dedicated to fostering meaningful conversations and community engagement.

This fall in Winnipeg, we are hosting two upcoming Roots of Reconciliation workshops. While the design of both workshops is the same, each is offered separately for Indigenous and non-Indigenous participants and led by trainers from that community.

The reason? The conversations that unfold are shaped by who is in the room, and that difference matters.

NEW Roots of Reconciliation Workshop for *Non-Indigenous* November 26-29, 2025

This 4-day experiential workshop invites participants to reflect on their own stories and perspectives, and to explore how these shape their relationships with others and with reconciliation. The reason? The conversations that unfold are shaped by who is in the room, and that difference matters.


NEW Roots of Reconciliation Workshop for *Indigenous -* December 11-14, 2025
