The Parish had been declared a Jubilee Pilgrimage site for the weekend by Archbishop LeGatt.




### \*NEW\* Let us all give a warm welcome to Mrs. Louise Normandeau who is with us since Tuesday, September 16,2025


### \*NEW\* Service of Installation for Bishop-elect Larry Kochendorfer - September 27, 2025

## \*REMINDER\* 2023 Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada - September 27-28, 2025

The Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada will take place on September 27 and 28. Each year, and with the generosity of Catholic faithful from coast to coast to coast, the Bishops of Canada continue their work on important doctrinal and ethical questions; ecumenical initiatives and interreligious dialogue; international relations; evangelization, faith education and catechesis; relations with Indigenous peoples; questions of social justice; and the development of a culture of life and family. In addition to their national Conference, the Bishops of Canada also meet in four Regional Assemblies (Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario and the West). The main purpose of the collection is to help the bishops pay their annual diocesan dues to the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), as well as any annual financial contribution to their regional episcopal assembly. In addition, any extra amounts collected can be used by the diocese for its own pastoral needs, although some bishops choose to give these extra amounts to the CCCB as a donation. You will find envelopes for this collection in your parishes.

# \*REMINDER\* 2025 Diocesan Study Days – October 24 or 25, 2025 This year's theme for Saint-Boniface's Diocesan Study Days is **Sexuality and Identity: Catholic Pastoral Accompaniment.** Listen to presentations by:

- Fr. Kevin Belgrave, professor at St. Augustine Seminary in Toronto who teaches on bioethics, foundations of moral theology, human sexuality, and Catholic social teachings. He'll be speaking to us about the Catholic anthropology of human sexuality.
- Dr. Julia Sadusky, clinical psychiatrist from Colorado who offers individual, family, and couples therapy in addition to consultations for individuals and families around sexuality and gender, and author of Start Talking to Your Kids about Sex: A Practical Guide for Catholics and Talking with Your Teen about Sex: A Practical Guide for Catholics.
- Deacon Gilles Urquhart, permanent deacon for the Archdiocese of Saint-Boniface and chaplain for Courage, which offers pastoral support in the form of spiritual guidance, community prayer support, and fellowship for those who experience same-sex attraction. He is also chaplain for EnCourage, an apostolate that helps its members work together to understand the experiences of their loved ones, and to respond to them with compassion.
- Bob Hall, a member of Courage since 1992, who will share his testimony of how Courage has helped him find faith, love, and community.

The presentations will be in English, with French simultaneous translation available for those who need it. There will be French and English small group discussions after each presentation, and opportunities for Q&A with the various speakers. Come either Thursday Oct 23, or Saturday Oct 25, from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM, at Saint-Boniface Cathedral Hall, 180 ave de la Cathédrale, Winnipeg. The same message will be shared each day.



#### **News From the CCCB**

## \*NEW\* Catholic Bishops of Canada Gather for the Annual Meeting of the Plenary Assembly

From September 22 to 26, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops will gather in Montreal for the annual Plenary Assembly. This meeting is always focused on how the Bishops of Canada can serve the Church's mission at the national level. The following are some of the topics that will be covered ...

**Episcopal Commission for Christian Unity, Religious Relations with Jews, and Interfaith Dialogues** – Chaired by the Most Rev. Donald Bolen, Archbishop of Regina, the Episcopal Commission will introduce its proposed National Ecumenical Strategy (NES).

**Pastoral Reflection** – In 2025, the Church commemorates the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, the first Ecumenical Council held in 325 AD. This milestone invites Christians of all traditions – Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant – to reflect on the Council's enduring legacy, to reaffirm the unity of faith articulated by the Council Fathers, and to recommit to fostering Christian unity today.

Standing Committee for Responsible Ministry and the Protection of Minors and Vulnerable Persons – The Standing Committee for Responsible Ministry will lead a discussion on its proposed Action Plan to Implement the Recommendations in Protecting Minors from Sexual Abuse (2018).


**Synod on "Synodality"** – Bishop Alain Faubert will update the members on the newly established *Ad hoc* Committee on the Implementation of the Synod on Synodality, and will outline how the CCCB can help Bishops at the local level during the implementation phase.

**Artificial Intelligence** - The Church's engagement with AI as a moral and social concern has grown in recent years. In January 2025, the Dicasteries for the Doctrine of the Faith and for Culture and Education issued *Antiqua et Nova*, examining AI and human intelligence, and in June, Pope Leo XIV highlighted the Church's role in guiding ethical reflection on AI.


