UPDATED Official unveiling of Tunkansida Inyan, the "Grandfather Rock" – June 20, 2025

You are invited to the official unveiling of M'Shoomisanin, the "Grandfather" Rock, on June 20 at the Heritage Garden, located at 151 avenue de la Cathédrale, on the grounds of the Diocesan Centre of the Archdiocese of Saint Boniface.

The ceremony will begin at 10 AM, with Elders Mary Courchene and Clayton Sandy, Archbishop Albert LeGatt and other guests in attendance. The ceremony is part of National Indigenous Peoples' Day, celebrated on June 21.

In the First Nations cultures of Turtle Island, sacred spiritual belief systems include all of creation and all beings within it.

For the Lakota (Sioux), the Grandfather Rock, Tunkansida, is the oldest one and is a way of describing the generational knowledge it carries and is sacred. Because of that, rocks must be respected.

In a sacred healing space like a sweat lodge, when the water strikes the heated stones and that mist rises, the rocks give up their spirit to help us heal, and it brings back the moment of creation.

The Anishinaabe people believe that rocks are one of the earliest gifts of the Creator and are called M'Shoomisaan, "Grandfather". They are sacred animate creations used in ceremonies.

The rocks have been witness to the passage of time and all that has occurred in that time. That history is held within the rocks and tell of our relationship with the land, the water, the sky and with all beings with whom we share this moment and this space.

The rocks are gifts from the Creator to cleanse and take illness away – physically, emotionally, mentally and spiritually. For as long as the sun shins, and the grass grows and the rivers flow, wo will the Tunkanisdapi and M'Shoomisaan "Grandfathers" hold the sacred ceremonies for all time.

Assumption University Graduate Diploma in Catholic Studies – Fall 2025 Admission now open DEADLINE TO SUBMIT IS AUGUST 15, 2025 AT NOON

Topics in Catholic Studies – Catholicism and Marginalization: CATH 8500 (3.00 Credit) – This course will focus on special topics on interest in

Catholic studies, such as, bioethics, education, literature, global poverty, migration, the saints, the papacy, social teachings, and theology of the body. This course's content will change on a yearly basis.

Directed Readings in Catholic Studies: CATH 8800 (3.00 Credit) – This course will allow students to study a specific topic not covered in detail by a course currently offered in the program. The students will select a topic and readings in consultation with an instructor. Typically, students will be permitted to complete this course once and only with permission from the Graduate Chair.

Major Paper in Catholic Studies: CATH 9000 (3.00 Credit) – This course will provide students with an opportunity to undertake an independent research project on any topic related to Catholic studies with the goal of writing a major paper that perhaps could be submitted to a refereed journal or edited book. In the course, students will submit a formal proposal that includes research questions, literature review, methods, and a preliminary bibliography.






Bridgefolk Conference 2025: Ecumenical Dialogue in an Age of Polarization – July 24-27, 2025

Bridgefolk is a grassroots ecumenical movement of Mennonites and Roman Catholics who work together toward Christian unity by "proceeding through friendship." Newcomers are always welcome at Bridgefolk gatherings, regardless of religious affiliation. Most of the conference will be held at First Mennonite Church, Winnipeg, Manitoba. One evening of the conference will be held at St. Kateri Catholic Parish - as its building lives the Mennonite - Catholic dialogue in a very practical way, since St. Kateri

and Aberdeen Mennonite Church share the same building and are starting to work on a few projects together. The evening at St. Kateri (Saturday, July 28) will be the foot-washing liturgy that is a feature of every Bridgefolk Conference. This year's conference will look at the birth of Anabaptism from both a Mennonite and a Roman Catholic perspective, what has changed in the past five centuries, and what the implications are for ecumenical dialogue today. "Trust, Rights, and Human Dignity" Podcast Now Available

Hear Dr. Stanley Amaladas of the Mauro Institute for Peace & Justice at St. Paul's College on the "Humans, On Rights" podcast: **"Trust, Rights, and Human Dignity"**. In this podcast, host Stuart Murray sits down with Dr. Stanley Amaladas, Director of the Arthur V. Mauro Institute for Peace and Justice at St. Paul's College and University of Manitoba. Dr. Amaladas reflects on his journey from Malaysia to Canada and shares a powerful story about his citizenship interview that shaped his understanding of human rights, responsibility, and dignity.

This podcast explores:

How an uncomfortable citizenship interview became a lesson about rights, power, and

- responsibility.
- The difference between the legal framework of rights and our human responsibility to others.
- Why "who's right and who's wrong?" is often the wrong question in conflict resolution.
- Amaladas' vision for continuing Arthur Mauro's dream of making Winnipeg a "cultural centre for hope".
- The importance of approaching difficult conversations with curiosity instead of judgment.
- How we can speak to those in positions of power "in a way that is not tyrannical".

Dr. Amaladas brings both academic expertise in Leadership Studies and personal experience to this thoughtful discussion about what it means to lead for peace. His perspective on treating people as people first - recognizing their dignity beyond their utility - offers an important lesson for navigating today's divided world. As Dr. Amaladas reminds us: "It's not going to come from theories or big ideas. It's going to come from people who treat people as people." **The podcast can be heard HERE.**
