***NEW* Assumption University Graduate Diploma in Catholic Studies - Fall 2026 Admission Now Open**

Graduate Diploma in Catholic Studies (Fall 2026), three courses offered

Catholicism Around the Globe: CATH 8300 (3.00 Credit)

This course will explore the diverse expressions of Catholicism by studying various Catholic communities from around the globe. Students will discover how Catholicism is practiced in the Middle East, Africa, Asia, South America, Oceania, and others. The course will examine the history of various Catholic communities, the major figures who played a role in shaping these communities, the unique religious customs, and the potential tensions between Rome and these communities. Students will also discuss the role of missionaries in spreading Catholicism, the effects of colonialism, religious persecution of Catholics, and ecumenical and interreligious dialogue.

Directed Readings in Catholic Studies: CATH 8800 (3.00 Credit)

This course will allow students to study a specific topic not covered in detail by a course currently offered in the program. The students will select a topic and readings in consultation with an instructor. It is required that students have weekly content and complete a final project at the conclusion of the course. Typically, students will be permitted to complete this course once and only with permission from the Graduate Chair.





Major Paper in Catholic Studies: CATH 9000 (3.00 Credit)

This course will provide students with an opportunity to undertake an independent research project on any topic related to Catholic studies with the goal of writing a major paper that perhaps could be submitted to a refereed journal or edited book.

In the course, students will submit a formal proposal that includes research questions, literature review, methods, and a preliminary bibliography.

After writing the paper, students will be required to present their paper at an oral presentation.

Admission is with permission of the Graduate Chair.

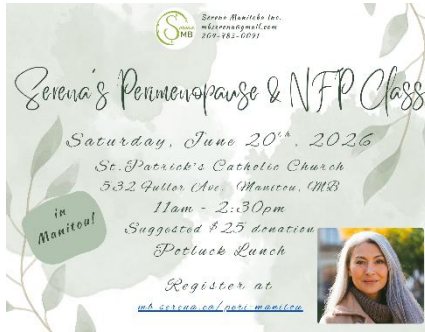

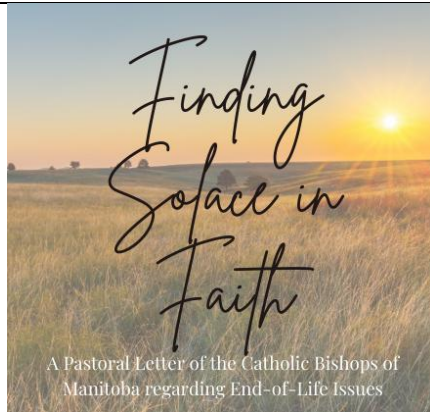


