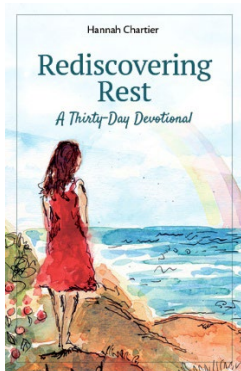

### **\*NEW\* Statement by the Standing Committee for Family and Life to the Catholic Faithful in Canada and All People of Good Will Voicing Concern and Calling for Prayers on the 10th Anniversary of Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide (“MAID”)**



A decade has passed since Bill C-14 received Royal Assent on 17 June 2016, legalizing euthanasia and assisted suicide across Canada, and permitting eligible adults, under specified conditions, to access what is legally termed “Medical Assistance in Dying” (“MAID”). As we mark this sobering anniversary, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (CCCB) Standing Committee for Family and Life invites the Catholic faithful and all people of goodwill to voice renewed concern about “MAID,” to remain steadfast in opposing euthanasia and assisted suicide, to pray for the conversion of hearts and minds away from this practice, and to be present to persons who are sick and vulnerable.

On the occasion of the G7 Summit held in France June 15 to 17, 2026, we, the Presidents of the Bishops' Conferences of the G7 member states, with the support of the President of the Commission of the Bishops' Conferences of the European Union, wish to address a united message to the Heads of State and Government, inspired by the Gospel and by the social teaching of the Church. Amid armed conflict, geopolitical fragmentation, the crisis of multilateralism, growing inequalities, climate disruption and accelerating technological change, we affirm that the dignity of the human person must remain the foundation of political and economic governance. The G7 bears a particular responsibility for the global common good. The decisions taken by member states have direct consequences for peoples, for international stability, and for the future of younger generations.

**\*REMINDER\* Knowledge-Sharing Symposium on the Doctrine of Discovery**

From 26 to 29 May 2026, a Knowledge-Sharing Symposium on the Doctrine of Discovery was held in Edmonton, examining the historical and legal consequences of colonization for Indigenous Peoples, and the Catholic Church's involvement in that colonization in the 15th and 16th centuries.

The event was hosted by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), with support from the Pontifical Committee for Historical Sciences, and representation from the Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development. It was organized by a group of Catholic men and women, Indigenous and Church leaders and scholars.

The invited participants came from Canada, the United States, Bolivia, Brazil, Mexico, Peru, France, Spain, and New Zealand. They included Indigenous leaders, Elders and Knowledge Keepers, Representatives of Original Nations of this continent, historians specializing in colonization, legal scholars, authors who have published articles and books on the Doctrine of Discovery, Catholic bishops and theologians, and participants coming from diverse spiritual traditions. >To read the complete CCCB press release, [click here](#).
