Best Practices in Welcoming a New Priest, New Families or New Cultures Suggestions from Diocesan Pastoral Council – November 2019

1. At the parish level, what are we already doing or what could we do to be more welcoming towards new families?

- A membership committee contacts new parishioners and visits them in their home.
- A member of the PPC should be taking the initiative to talk to newer parishioners: "how are you?"
- More greeters/ushers at the door to meet people.
- Saying hello at mass; inviting them to breakfast/lunch, social events
- Finding out their interests, ministries, needs

- Why did they choose your parish?
- Families in need, no charge for parish events
- Mixing with other cultures, letting them take the lead
- Recognizing new parishioners
- Respecting their culture and the way they do things
- Inviting them to social events and including them
- Welcoming everyone at mass also welcomes newcomers

2. At the parish level, what are we already doing or what could we do to be more welcoming towards a new priest?

*new priest: a new international priest who arrives, a newly ordained priest or a priest who receives a new appointment

- Welcome potluck or breakfast
- Official welcome before mass
- Potluck (for CPP, FC).
- Personal check-in with priest (rectory) 1-1
- Inviting priest to meetings, social events, homes
- Priest "serves" at breakfasts
- Individual family takes priest out for lunch after mass
- Cleaning rectory before arrival
- Inviting the priest to parish lunches/events
- Having a community contact list

- Respecting his diet
- Welcoming him into our homes
- Giving him warm clothing
- Checking up on the priest for emergencies
- Providing the priest with the parish photo directory
- Inviting the priest for supper
- Providing an introductory bio of the priest to the parishioners (maybe publish in the bulletin) and a bio of the parish to the priest
- Taking the priest to a Bombers/Jets game
- Providing the priest with local foods

3. At the parish level, what are we already doing or what could we do to be more welcoming towards new cultures or ethnic groups?

- Cultural themed dinner or social gatherings
- Representation on PPC
- Visible ethnic groups welcoming parishioners
- Highlighting different languages at Mass (example: Christmas Eve Mass)
- Recognizing ethnic cultural Catholic practices (ex: Polish Easter baskets, Filipino novena masses)
- Cultural cooking classes for each ethnic group
- Learning a few phrases in their language

- Potluck with food from their culture
- Taking them to mass in their own language/culture
- Welcome dish/meal, inviting them to your home
- Inviting them to non-parish community events
- Hosting a mini Folklorama in the parish
- Bringing them to diocese celebrations
- Special field trips (\$\$, transportation barriers) Transcona, Gimli, The Forks, the beach, the zoo
- Including the sponsored refugee family in church social events
