Forming/Revitalizing a Parish Pastoral Council (PPC)

"It is increasingly clear that in a parish, the two key sources and prime movers are the Pastors or Parish Life Directors, and the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). Archbishop LeGatt, April 2018

Whether a parish already has a Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) and would like to revitalize it, or whether there is no existing PPC, the following are steps that may guide you. The Diocesan Committee for the Renewal and Growth of Parish Pastoral Councils (PPC) are on hand to walk this journey with you. We are available to work with you in person, through Zoom, on the phone This process has proven successful in parishes.

The primary ingredients are PRAYER AND DISCERNMENT

Forming an Ad Hoc Committee

An Ad Hoc Committee is a group of people, (suggested 6-8) including the Pastor or Parish Life Director, gathered together for a short term, in order to reach a specific GOAL.

PARISHES <u>WITH</u> A PPC

The Diocesan Renewal & Growth Committee always meets with the Pastor or Parish Life Director and PPC chair(s) <u>before</u> meeting with the PPC to share information as to the needs of the parish and present the Revitalization Process.

After determining the need for <u>revitalizing</u> the existing PPC, the Pastor (or Parish Life Director), and members of the PPC reach out to parishioners who have talents and charisms that would assist them in this endeavour and invite them to the <u>first meeting</u> to form the Ad Hoc Committee for the Revitalization of the PPC. These invited parishioners may be people who are already involved in the parish in one way or another, or who have particular talents or experiences.

It is important that the Ad Hoc committee is representative of the parish, (gender, culture, age...) A meeting date will then be set up for a presentation to PPC members and invited parishioners. This group will become the Ad Hoc Committee.

PARISHES WITHOUT A PPC:

The Diocesan Renewal & Growth Committee always meets with the Pastor or Parish Life Director to share information as to the needs of the parish and present the process for the <u>Forming</u>. The Pastor or Parish Life Director then reaches out to parishioners who have talents and charisms that would assist them in this endeavour and invite them to the <u>first meeting</u> to form the Ad Hoc Committee for the Forming of a PPC. These invited parishioners may be people who are already involved in the parish in one way or another, or who have particular talents or experiences.

It is important that the Ad Hoc committee is representative of the parish. (gender, culture, age...) A meeting date will then be set up for a presentation to PPC members or interested parishioners. This group will become the Ad Hoc Committee.

An Ad Hoc Committee is a group of people, including the Pastor or Parish Life Director, gathered together for a short term, in order to reach a specific GOAL.

Agenda for FIRST meeting:

- 1. Welcome
- 2. Prayer to Holy Spirit
- 3. PPC Chairperson and Pastor or Parish Life Director clarify the GOALS for this Ad Hoc Committee:

GOAL #1: With the help and guidance of the Diocesan Renewal & Growth committee, this Ad Hoc Committee is gathered to follow the steps toward the GOAL of a Parish Survey and the formation of or revitalization of a PPC.

GOAL #2: Compile and present feedback from the Parish Survey for the parishioners and PPC. This feedback is used to establish priorities for the newly formed or revitalized PPC.

- 4. Decide who will be the Chairperson of this Ad Hoc Committee
- 5. Review duties of each committee:
 - a). Prayer Committee
 - b). Survey Committee
 - c) Communications Committee
- 6. Have a Chairperson for each committee.
- 7. Remaining members chose the committee they wish to be part of.
- 8. Determine a date for the Survey Weekend. (give yourself 5-7 week ends)
- 9. Determine next meeting date.

Prayer Committee:

- Formulate a "Parish Prayer" for the successful Formation or Revitalization of the PPC. This prayer should reflect <u>your</u> parish strengths, needs & goals. (Numerous prayer examples are provided by the Renewal & Growth Committee. Words and/or phrases may be used from these examples to help formulate your own prayer.)
- Present draft to whole committee to agree as a final copy.
- Make Prayer cards (4" X 6") with the newly formulated prayer for the revitalization/renewal and growth of the parish. (Prayer card examples are provided by the Renewal & Growth Committee).
- Distribute prayer card to all parishioners before masses on the first weekend.
- Before Mass, your Pastor or PPC Chair or Chairperson of the Prayer Committee explains the upcoming Survey Weekend and its purpose, and invites parishioners to bring the Prayer Card home and take time to pray it. This Prayer should be recited at every Mass, and be included in every bulletin, on your website, etc. All information should be included in the bulletin and in whatever means of communication you may have. (Facebook, etc...) All communication is handled by the Communication Committee. It is important that there is a strong exchange of information between the 3 committees as to the information to be shared with the parishioners.
- Prayer cards could also be distributed directly to other organizations in your parish asking them to pray for the success of this initiative and to encourage members to participate. (Knights of Columbus, prayers groups, catechetic, CWL....)
- Prayer cards could also be distributed or made available for a few weekends assuring that all parishioners receive it.

NOTE: The PRAYER committee works very closely with the Survey and Communications committees to assure that all information gets to the parishioners, (bulletins and all available media supports).

Survey Committee

(1) Prepare a Survey. A survey is a way of getting feedback by including all parishioners. We strongly suggest no more than two questions and space for general comments. One question should deal with the present and the second about what they wish to see in the future.

For example:

- a. What do you like about our parish?
- b. What would you like to see in our parish?
- c. Comments:

The whole Committee should be in agreement with your Survey questions.

- (2) Survey Week-end is the date the whole Ad Hoc committee has decided at first meeting 5-7 weeks to accomplish the various steps in this process.
- (3) One or two members of the Survey committee are responsible for printing the surveys on cardstock paper. Keep in mind to have a large enough piece of paper to allow room for written comments. (half an 8 x 11 sheet)
- (4) Purchase small pencils to be handed out along with Survey "card". Small/golf pencils can be purchased by the box
- (5) Decide how the paper surveys will be collected on Survey Week-end. You may decide to have them returned in the collection plate, to hand it in at the end of Mass.
- (6) Consider having some surveys available for members who are absent.
- (7) If you decide to have the survey available on-line have a member be responsible for setting it up and collecting the responses.
- (8) In collaboration with the Communications Committee, Survey question as well as the Prayer should appear in every bulletin, along with any information that the Communication Committee will be including

Survey Weekend

- (1) Assign 2 people for each Mass on Survey Sunday to hand out Survey cards and pencils as parishioners enter the church and to collect in the manner you decide
- (2) The designated members arrive on time to hand out Survey cards and pencils as parishioners enter the church. These 2 people can also collect Survey cards and pencils in the manner they choose. (i.e. as parishioners exit, at Collection time, etc)

- (3) Before Mass, Pastor or a member of the Ad Hoc committee give a last explanation about the Survey and how it will be conducted that day. Encouraging words from the Pastor are very helpful as well as explaining how these survey questions will be collected.
- (4) Allow 10 minutes at the start for parishioners to answer Survey questions. (not 10 minutes before Mass time, but 10 minutes at Mass time) Encouraging words from the Pastor would be very helpful as well as explaining how these survey questions will be collected.
- (5) Mass will then begin 10 minutes later than usual.
- (6) Surveys collected as previously decided

Analyzing Survey responses:

- this step should take place as soon as possible after the Survey week-end You may decide to give one more week for responses if you have sent Survey on-line)

- (1) Survey Committee meets to organize the responses from each question and arrange them in categories. The categories listed in the document: "Seven Essential Elements of Parish Life" are very complete & helpful. A member can enter responses onto a spreadsheet or table if not using a computer. These results provide you with the priorities that have been identified and serve as direction for the PPC.
- (2) At a meeting, the Survey committee presents the results of the survey and its priorities to the whole Ad Hoc committee.

At this meeting the chair of the Ad Hoc committee thanks the members for their work and declares the Ad Hoc committee dissolved.

All are invited to state if they wish to remain on the PPC in any capacity. (names are recorded)

(3) Lastly you will present the top 3-5 priorities to the congregation and the newly established PPC who will commence working on them. This can be done in the Sunday bulletin, on the website, at mass, etc...

NOTE: The SURVEY committee works very closely with the Prayer and Communications committee to assure that all information gets to the parishioners, (bulletins and all available media supports).

Communications Committee

It is MOST important to build up the anticipation for this event with continuous information and repeating the survey questions various times before the Survey Week-end. This gives the parishioners information about a PPC, its functions, etc. and also gives them time to think about the Survey questions.

NOTE: The COMMUNICATIONS committee works very closely with the Prayer and Survey committees to assure that all information gets to the parishioners, (bulletin and all available media supports).

The Communications committee works very closely with the Prayer & Survey committees to assure that all information gets to the parishioners. (bulletin and all available media supports)

- (a) The Communications Committee includes information about the upcoming survey in the bulletins and other media for each Sunday before the Survey weekend. Include the questions, why you are doing this survey; what will the answers be used for. All the information regarding a PPC can be found online in the Upper Room Document. Key items could be copied and pasted in the bulletin.
- (b) Assign someone or ask to announce the upcoming survey before each Mass to create anticipation.
 *Having a variety of people speak is key to being successful.
- (c) Send the information through a letter to existing organizations in your parish. (Knights of Columbus, prayer groups, Catholic Women's League, Adult Faith Study group)
- (d) If you choose, someone can make posters with the date of the survey and the questions. A smaller version of the poster could also be included in the bulletin.
- (e) Communisations committee will see to it that, along with the Survey results, a THANK YOU to the parishioners for their participation should appear in the bulletin as well as a Thank you to the Ad Hoc committee members.

Revitalization/Formation

Revitalization:

The Ad Hoc Committee hands over the organized Survey responses to the PPC. Using the feedback presented and the priorities indicated, the PPC may choose to reorganize accordingly. This marks the end of the Ad Hoc Committee's mandate.

Members of Ad Hoc Committee who were already on the PPC may remain to form the new PPC. See Upper Room Guidelines. – https://www.archsaintboniface.ca/ The document is in the pull down menu Diocesan Services in Renewal & Growth of Parish Pastoral Councils.

A Communications ministry is important to continue providing parishioners with on-going information as to the work of their representatives, the members of the PPC.

Formation:

The Upper Room (Guidelines) document provides the information for the formation of the PPC.

Members of the Ad Hoc Committee may certainly remain to form a PPC if they wish. The priorities raised in the Survey will guide the PPC on where to begin.

APPENDIX 1

Categories used to Compile Survey Feedback (Based on "The Seven Essential Elements of Parish Life" document found on our website – https://www.archsaintboniface.ca/ The document is in the pull down menu Diocesan Services in Renewal & Growth of Parish Pastoral Councils.

EVANGELIZATION:

- Efforts are made to reach out to the alienated, the inactive, and the unchurched.
- Opportunities are provided for small groups to gather and share faith as it relates to their everyday life.

• Parish renewals, evenings of prayer and/or retreat days are planned to enliven and deepen the faith of the people.

• The parish takes steps to influence the values and decisions of the larger community through prophetic action and works of justice and outreach.

WORSHIP

• Competent individuals are responsible for every aspect of liturgical celebrations.

• Quality in music, including instruments, musicians, and hymn selection, enables the assembly to participate in sung prayer

• All the sacraments are celebrated regularly, with attention given to making them true expressions of the life of the parish.

• Devotional prayer is encouraged, but does not interfere with the primary sacramental celebrations of the parish.

WORD

• The parish Catechetical leader has appropriate education, ability, and experience to provide catechist formation and effective administration of religious education efforts.

• Religious formation or catechesis is planned and evaluated for all in the parish: adults, youth, and children.

• Strengthening marriages and nurturing the life of families are priorities for the parish.

Assistance in provided to help parents understand their roles as ministries to their children in the formation of Christian values.

COMMUNITY

• There is good spirit of working together among parish groups and organizations.

• Programming for parish organizations consistently offers prayer, information, education, entertainment, and hospitality.

• There is an annual review of the purpose, effectiveness, and need for each parish organization.

• The parish collaborates with the neighboring parishes as appropriate to enhance the mission of the Church.

SERVICE

• The parish focuses on the needs of the human community, beginning with its own members and extending to the poor and marginalized in the local area, the nation, and the world.

• The parish makes every effort accommodate persons with special needs.

• Programs that minister to the sick, the bereaved and the homebound are ongoing.

• Racial and ethnic harmony, peacemaking and non-violence, respect for life at all stages, and the practice of spiritual and corporal works of mercy are priority areas for study and action in the parish.

STEWARDSHIP

• Formation efforts help parishioners understand their baptismal responsibility to steward their gifts, including the gifts of faith and life in the church.

• Parishioners who offer their gifts in service to the parish mission are given adequate training, encouragement, and supervision.

• The parish is not overly dependent on extraordinary fund-raisers to support its ordinary budget.

• The Finance Council reflects persons with interest and experience in budgeting,

facilities management, and fundraising and development efforts.

LEADERSHIP -

• The pastoral concerns of the parish are assessed, evaluated, and responded to by the parish and pastoral council in collaboration with the pastor and parish staff.

• Decisions are made by consensus after a process of discernment, study, and discussion.

• On-going formation and training of parish leaders is provided for and is informed by universal church teachings.

• Willingness to share staff with other parishes is considered a viable means of ensuring competency in ministerial leadership.

EUCHARIST AT THE CENTER:

• The Sunday Eucharist is a priority in the life of the parish and is celebrated with full and active participation of the parishioners.

• Well-trained and effective parishioners serve in many liturgical ministries at Sunday Eucharist.

• Preaching is directly related to the Scriptures and to the real-life experience of the people.

APPENDIX 2

Celebration of Recognition/Commissioning of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC)

The form proposed here is for the recognition of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). This recognition of the PPC is presided by the pastor or his delegate and would normally take place during Eucharist on Sunday or on another day when as many people as possible can gather. (Parish Ministries, pgs.134-141)

INTRODUCTION (after Introductory Rites):

The Presider may briefly explain the significance of the Celebration of Recognition of PPC which will be taking place after the Homily.

OPENING PRAYER:

PRESIDER: O God, the giver of every perfect gift, by the grace of baptism, you adopt us as Your own and call

Deliver us from self-seeking and cause us to work for the common good.

Keep us loyal to Christ in all we set out to accomplish that the praise and glory may be Yours alone.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who live and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

ALL: Amen

RECOGNITION (after the Homily):

PRESIDER: "Let the member of the PPC please come forward."

The names of the PPC member are called out as they come forward and stand before the assembly.

<u>PRESIDER</u>: Dear friends, these members of our parish have accepted to serve as an advisory body to the Pastor, and for the parish of (name). In sharing their gifts and wisdom, they have the pastoral needs of this entire faith community at heart. Let us pray for their perseverance in this important service.

COMMITMENT:

PRESIDER: addresses and questions the PPC:

My brothers and sisters, you are called to a most important work in our community. Your duty is to foster the pastoral activity of this parish, to help all of us to grow in faithfulness to the Gospel; to be the disciples of Christ that we are called to be.

Because of our knowledge and competence, you have been chosen to share your insights with one another, with your pastor and the whole pastoral team, for the well-being of the entire parish and the building of the kingdom of God.

Therefore, I ask each of you, are you willing to share your insights honestly, with courage and with mutual respect?

PPC members: I am.

<u>PRESIDER</u>: Are you committed to work together with openness to the needs of every member of this parish community?

PPC members: I am.

<u>PRESIDER</u>: Will you strive to make prayer a part of your daily life, ensuring that in all deliberations you are open to the grace of the Holy Spirit? PPC members: I am.

PRAYER OF BLESSING:

PRESIDER: Let us pray. All pray silently for a moment. The Presider then extends his hands and continues:

Ever-living God, You have chosen us to be your beloved people, and have gathered us to live in this parish of (name), to proclaim the Gospel of Christ to all people, and to love and serve you in word, worship, and work.

Bestow your blessings upon these members of our Parish Pastoral Council and let their deliberations be pleasing to you. May your Spirit enlighten their minds, and guide their actions that they may be renewed in faith, united in love, and bring to fulfillment the work of your Church. For your honour and glory and for the benefit of all your people. Blessed are you Lord God, for ever and ever.

All: Amen

PRESENTATION OF A SYMBOL OF THEIR WORK:

The members of the PPC may receive copy of the Bible, or the Constitution of the PPC, or some other symbol of their work.

<u>PRESIDER</u>: Take to heart your responsibility for the parish community and strive to grow in faithfulness to the Gospel.

PPC members respond Amen

GENERAL INTERCESSIONS (Prayer of the faithful)

The members of the PPC return to their places and the General Intercessions follow. These should include an intention for the PPC and for the Parish community. One of the following may be used or adapted:

That the members of our Parish Pastoral Council may give witness to the presence of Christ by lives manifesting faith, hope and love. We pray to the Lord.

That the Church, the People of God, may grow in Christ and in the bond of common fellowship. We pray to the Lord.

That all who are concerned with the welfare of our parish, may open to the movement of the Holy Spirit, and strive to carry out God's will. We pray to the Lord.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST: The celebration of the Eucharist continues and concludes as usual. It is appropriate for some of the members of the PPC to present the gifts of bread and wine for the celebration.

PRAYER EXAMPLES

To make the Parish Prayer your own, you may already have one that suits you OR you may choose certain words/phrases that you feel best speak for your parish from the samples here and compose your own.

 Heavenly Father, we thank you for gathering us together at ______ Parish. Thank you for calling us to serve as your disciples. You have charged us through you Son Jesus, with the great mission of evangelizing and witnessing your love in our community and to the world.
