The last session of Scripture Studies will start this coming February. This series of study sessions, presented by Brother Camille Légaré, c.s.v., started in October 2006. Two sessions have been presented each year since. each session offered both in French and in English at the Pastoral Centre. The study of Psalms took place before Christmas 2010 and the series closes with the study of the Book of Revelations. World Youth Day

The 26th World Youth Day (WYD) will be held this summer in Madrid from August 16 to 21. Nearly 50 young people between 18 to 30 years of age from our three dioceses are preparing to go as part of a group organized here in Saint Boniface. Their guides are Kurt Nugent of the Outreach Team from the Catholic School of Evangelization in St Malo and Erin Kinsella who is in charge of Youth Ministry for the Archdiocese of Winnipeg.

Since October, the pilgrims meet once a month for spiritual preparation, to learn about pilgrimages and to discover what they can expect at WYD. In May, they will attend a retreat. The send-off mass will be held on August 7th.

Once in Spain, they will participate in the Guadarrama Festival (Aug. 10-15), organized by the Chemin Neuf Community (<u>http://jeunes.chemin-neuf.org/index.php</u>) and visit Avila; they will engage in three days of reflection after the event. This pilgrimage costs each participant \$2700; many are currently fund-raising. Each participant also needs encouragement, prayers and support.

Missionary Commissioning

"Have a lot of fun, go with open hearts and you will be blessed." With those words of encouragement, Archbishop LeGatt blessed the missionaries during the first commissioning in our diocese. The event, organized by Sister Pauline Lagassé, f.d.l.c., was held this past December 12th, in the Cathedral. They were preparing to leave for underdeveloped countries in the coming year.

In speaking to the assembly, the archbishop emphasized that our task is not to simply make Jesus known in those countries because we know that Jesus Christ is already there. But by our actions, our task is to help people discover the presence of Christ in their daily realities.

This is a road with two directions. First, go; bring the gift of life, hope, peace, justice and share the love of Christ to bring Life. Then, let those you enter in relationship with evangelize you by their culture, poverty, suffering and joys and come back transformed by the experience and ready to give back to your Church and your communities.

Six groups leave this year:

- Students from Collège universitaire de Saint-Boniface went to Mali to plant trees in December, under the leadership of Sister Norma McDonald.

- Students from Collège Louis-Riel are currently in Dominican Republic to build homes with Marie-Christine Dauriac.

- Adults from several parishes south of Winnipeg will go to Peru to build an orphanage. The *Red River Mission*, with Denis Robert, leaves in February. (See <u>http://rrmrr.blogspot.com/</u>)

- Students from Collège régional Gabrielle-Roy and École communautaire Réal-Bérard will be in Rwanda in March to work with youth. It is the third mission under the leadership of Mayur Raval.

- Father Gérard Dionne's recent retirement allows him to go to Laos, Cambodia and Thailand to assess projects already started and begin new ones. He will be away for several weeks.

- Students from several high schools will be in El Salvador in March with Dennis Kuzenko of St Alphonsus Parish. In June, students from St Mary's Academy will go, followed in July by a group from St Paul's High School. Among other things, they will work with youth and build a home. These will be the 5th, 6th and 7th youth missions. There have also been seven missions with adults. (See http://www.stalphonsus.ca/es/index.html)

All these missionaries, as well as the people they will encounter, need your prayers.
