Message from Our Archbishop

Dear friends.

Manitoba's Passion Play

July 8-10, 2011 marked the 12th year that Manitoba's Passion Play has to come to life in the outdoor setting, on a hillside in La Rivière. It burst forth with a breath of new life this year as a grant and several private contributions allowed construction of a new set.

The script was rewritten and new scenes such as the early life of Jesus and the Sermon on the Mount were added.

A live orchestra was providing the musical setting. This volunteer effort brought 1500 viewers to the performances. A new Stations of the Cross will be installed on the existing meditation trail that leads up the hill towards the audience area. The set of painted tableaux were blessed by Father Ryszard Machura of Saint John the Evangelist parish in Morden and put in place by the Langevin Council of the Knights of Columbus of Somerset.

Prior to the Sunday's performance, His Grace Archbishop LeGatt celebrated the outdoor Mass. His homily was a beautiful reflection on the seeds of faith. He stayed on to enjoy the evening's performance. Planning for Manitoba's Passion Play is already under way for July 2012.

Meet...Léonce Aubin - Chancellor

Father Léonce is Chancellor of the archdiocese since 1999. The main function of this administrative position is to ensure that the official papers of the diocese be written according to Canon Law, or the law of the Church. The chancellor also sees that these documents, as well as all reports from the parishes are archived at the Archbishop's House. Father Léonce sits on several committees and works at the discretion of the Bishop.



Prior to this, Father Léonce has been pastor in many parishes of the diocese and he presently serves at Notre-Damede-l'Assomption parish in Transcona.

Stewardship: Salt of the Earth... Light of the World (Mt 5:13-14)

Do you hear the call? Each and every one of us is gifted with a variety of talents for a reason. God's great plan is to enable us to discover how we are gifted and to allow us to put to good use those talents generously given to us. God is calling us to be Church.

Stewardship is rooted in the teachings and life of Christ. Remember the parable of the talents? (Mt 25:14-30) One was given one talent and another five, but the expectation was that each

recipient give back the same as was received. We are blessed with talents not to keep to ourselves or for our own enrichment, but to share with our community. This is how we are more fully going to experience the joy of our faith and God's presence amongst us. It is a vital part in completing the Body of Christ.

We are called to become vulnerable and place ourselves at the service of others that they too may come to experience and recognize Christ. We can do this in our parishes, by sharing our faith with children in the catechetic program, by leading the congregation to praise God in song,

by serving others as a member of a Catholic organization. Others may be called to work in the inner city with the poor or by doing humanitarian work. In sharing the time, talent and treasure that God has blessed us with we are endlessly rewarded; this is God's promise to us through His Son.
