Music Retreat and folk fest



On August 16-18, 2013 the Catholic School of Evangelization (CSE) along with the youth ministry offices from Steinbach and St. Anne hosted the first MUSIC Retreat and Faith-Filled Folk Fest. This event came out of the desire to provide a retreat for those who are involved in music ministry – to give back to those who give of themselves to our parishes.

Matthew Gray, the Director of Music/Liturgy for Immaculate Parish in Owensboro, Kentucky, spoke to retreatants about his own experience in music ministry, the attitude of a music minister and how music and prayer go together. *Illuminate*, a ministry focused on Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, joined us for an evening of Adoration and music in the St. Malo Grotto. This evening touched both retreatants and presenters alike.

Sarah Farthing of Saskatoon, did a workshop on song writing, giving us pointers on how to build a song. Joseph Madden, of JOLT, shared about Leading Worship. All of the presenters shared from their wealth of experience and retreatants walked away with a greater understanding of the call to music ministry.

On Saturday night of the retreat there was a Faith-Filled Folk Fest with Joe Ordinary, Fox and Runner - two local musicians, as well as Sarah Farthing. This was held at the beautiful outdoor venue of the St. Malo Grotto. It was a beautiful evening of music and a great way to wrap up the retreat.

This, along with workshops on various topics of interest, activities for the young people, two meals shared together, and fine musical entertainment, made for a very enjoyable and energizing event gathering around 500 people from all across the diocese.



Next year, the Diocesan Gathering will take place on May 30th and 31st and again will be an occasion to come together to be strengthened in our common faith and Church life. Thus renewed by the power of the Holy Spirit, we can all grow together in the ways of being a Church of communion that knows how to invite all to come to Jesus Christ.

As we begin our pastoral efforts anew, let us join in common prayer for all of our parishes and for all the faithful of our diocese. May the Lord Jesus continue to lead us along the way to the Kingdom of God.

A Taste of Cana

In this retreat house, near the river, our days followed the rhythm of order, tranquility and prayer. Peace permeated everything. One of the missions of the *Chemin Neuf* Community is to offer couples retreats called Cana. This year, the Community organized its first retreat, held August 7-13. Its purpose was to enrich the journey of married couples. Like all living organisms, a couple's relationship needs to be nurtured in order to grow.

What looked to be at first an adventure into the unknown quickly became an anticipation of the unexpected from God. A few years ago, Saints-Martyrs-Canadiens Parish started the 'Beginning of the School Year Mass and the Blessing of School Bags' in order to place this special time for the beginning of the school and catechetic year under the guidance and protection of the Holy Spirit, and to give a sacred meaning to our general and sacramental catechetics. Thus we bring the Lord on board, in our school bags.

During this family-oriented Mass, held this year on September 15, students proceed in the church with their school bags on their shoulders and lay them at the Altar. It is during this celebration

Centenary Celebration in Richer

On Sunday June 23rd, families, friends and former parishioners gathered at Enfant-Jésus Church in Thibaultville (Richer) to celebrate the centenary of its founding.

Regular services have not been held in the church since 1995. Archbishop LeGatt presided and Fr. Gabriel Lévesque concelebrated at the Eucharistic Celebration. Knights of Columbus from St. Anne and St. Boniface set up an honour guard in the church and later in the cemetery. Traditional hymns in French, English and Latin, led by Fr Robbie McDougall of *Adoramus Minstries*, filled the sacred space, recalling for many faithful precious moments from the past.

At the beginning of the celebration, four generations of the Nault family formed a procession carrying symbols that the priest blesses these bags, symbols of the school year, as well as our efforts, joys, challenges and successes to come. He also blesses all school-age youth, catechised or not, their families, teachers, catechism teachers and all who devote their time to make God better known and loved.

The young people are able to participate actively in moments significant to them in this celebration: welcome, procession, universal prayer, serving at the Altar, offerings (Bible, school books, school bag, bread, wine, collection), homily shared as they sit at the foot of the Altar and sometimes the re-
